The American Heart Association presents the Get With The Guidelines[®] - Coronary Artery Disease NSTEMI Gold award for implementation of quality treatment, care coordination for heart attack patients.

Wenatchee, WA: Confluence Health Hospital Central Campus has received the American Heart Association's [Get With The Guidelines[®] – Coronary Artery Disease](#) NSTEMI Gold recognition for its commitment to offering rapid, research-based care to people experiencing a specific type of heart attack known as a non-ST elevation myocardial infarction (NSTEMI).

Each year, more than 1 million cases of acute coronary syndrome (ACS) require hospitalization in the U.S., and about 70% of ACS cases are classified as NSTEMI, caused by a partial blockage in a coronary artery.^{1,2}

“In the event of an NSTEMI heart attack, adherence to the American Heart Association’s guidelines is critical. These guidelines include specific recommendations for in-hospital care and cardiac rehabilitation post-discharge,” said Abhinav Goyal, M.D., MHS, FACC, FAHA, volunteer chair of the American Heart Association Coronary Artery Disease System of Care Advisory Group.

The NSTEMI award is earned by hospitals that demonstrate a commitment to treating patients according to the most up-to-date research-based guidelines for NSTEMI care as outlined by the American Heart Association.

“Confluence Health is dedicated to improving the quality of heart attack care and the American Heart Association’s Get With The Guidelines program helps us achieve that goal,” said Dr. Liam Morris, physician medical director for the cath lab at Confluence Health. “The program puts proven knowledge and guidelines to work on a daily basis so patients have the best possible chance of survival.”
